

## HONEYCRISP APPLE

A crisp, sweet, and well balanced apple. It is self-pollinating, but pairs well with most other apple varieties for a higher yield.

## GALA APPLE

Semi-dwarf and self-pollinating; great for eating, baking, and freezing.

## GOLDEN DELICIOUS APPLE

Sweet apple great for fresh eating, applesauce, pies, and preserves.

Requires another Golden Delicious to pollinate.

## STATE FAIR APPLE

All-purpose apple that is lively and tart. Pollinates well with Winecrisp.

## WINECRISP APPLE

Bred at the University of Illinois, Winecrisp is juicy with full, spicy flavors and a good shelf life. Pollinates well with Honeycrisp and State Fair.

## MONTMORENCY TART CHERRY

Popular tart cherry for pies and preserves. A cold-hardy hybrid species that ripens early in the season. This variety is self-pollinating.

## NORTH STAR CHERRY

Large, tart fruit that is great for pies. This variety is self-pollinating.

## RAINIER SWEET CHERRY

Large, yellow-red fruit excellent for baking, canning, freezing and eating.

Requires another Sweet Cherry pollinator.

## RED HAVEN PEACH

Early fruit with golden-red color. Self-pollinating but higher yielding with other peach nearby.

## BARTLETT PEAR

Produces large, yellow fruit ideal for eating, canning and preserves.

Pollinates well with Bartlett, D'Anjou or any other pear variety.

## D'ANJOU PEAR

Bright green and firm fruit at harvest, with excellent shelf life and buttery sweet flavor. Pollinates well with Bartlett, D'Anjou or any other pear variety.
